

THE FIRST DECADE

The 1959 convention marks the end of the first decade of exhibiting by the Florida Artist Group in circuited exhibits, showing the work of Florida's professional painters throughout the eastern United States and part of Canada. Many galleries have made the showing of the Florida Artist Group an annual event. All told, the exhibits have been shown in Beaumont, Texas; Alexandria and New Orleans, Louisiana; Oxford, Columbus and Laurel, Mississippi; Birmingham and Montgomery, Alabama; Columbus, Athens, and Augusta, Georgia; Columbia and Greenville, South Carolina; Charlotte and Wilson, North Carolina; Buck Hill Falls, Pennsylvania; Rochester and Utica, New York; Springfield, Massachusetts; Shepherdstown, West Virginia; Athens, Ohio; Indianapolis, Indiana; Saginaw, Michigan; Kenosha, Wisconsin; Memphis, Tennessee; Windsor, London, and Hamilton, Ontario; and Salt Lake City, Utah; in addition to many cities in Florida. The 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th annual shows were successfully booked for 24 month tours, the 6th and 7th being shown 24 times in 24 months each, an exceptional performance. Tours have now been limited to 12 months.

FOREWORD

The Tenth Annual Symposium and Exhibition of the Florida Artist Group was held in cooperation with the University of Miami's Art Department, at the Lowe Gallery in Coral Gables and at the Playhouse Gallery, 350 Main Highway, Coconut Grove, Florida, March 12, 13 & 14, 1959.

The convention opened on Thursday evening, March 12, with a formal opening of the exhibition at the Playhouse Gallery, where members of the Group were able to view the 103 entries from as many artists, all parts of the state of Florida being represented.

Mr. Thomas Tibbs, Director of the Museum of Contemporary Crafts, New York, acting as sole juror, selected 30 paintings for circuit to form the present exhibition. Two of the selected paintings were sold during the showing, and have been replaced.

Florida Artist Group exhibitions are selected by the one-man jury system, always a man of national stature in the art world. Such distinguished leaders in the field of fine arts as Robert Parsons, Bartlett Hayes, Jr., Lamar Dodd, Homer Saint-Gaudens, Wilbur D. Peat, Thomas M. Beggs, Robert B. Hale, and Fred Conway have served as jurors in the past.

SYMPOSIUM, 1959

The annual Symposium and Exhibition is held each year in a different city in Florida; Gainesville, Clearwater, Sarasota, Daytona Beach, West Palm Beach, Bradenton, Winter Park, Tampa, and Miami have entertained the Group in convention.


In March, 1959, the new, deluxe Playhouse Gallery in Coconut Grove, south of Miami, Jack Amoroso, Director, acted as host gallery, while the Art Department of the University of Miami in Coral Gables carried on the Symposium, on the subject of Religion and Art.

A superb exhibition of Religious Paintings was displayed in the Lowe Gallery, together with a collection of Southwest Santos, the Alfred Barton Collection. The Gallery was transformed into a likeness of the Interior of a Cathedral, by the simple device of bending lattice strips into arches overhead, a very clever and effective installation.

A visit to Vizcaya, E. Robert Hunter, Director, was scheduled for the Group on March 7. Also on Saturday, the annual luncheon and business meeting was held at the Playhouse Gallery.

CIRCUIT EXHIBITIONS

The Florida Artist Group is one of many organizations presently engaged in circuiting art exhibitions through the eastern United States, having sent nine shows on tour since 1950. In general, such circuit exhibitions supplement the showings of local work and national or large regional exhibitions staged by your gallery, serving to introduce the artists of other localities with their sometimes different technical or aesthetic discoveries; in this respect they serve an educational purpose, for the particular benefit of your local artists. To the public, they offer a widened horizon of entertainment and artistic discovery. There are many kinds of circuit exhibits on tour, covering virtually every known facet of human art. Some are sent free of charge, some at rental fees which vary extremely; almost all represent a transportation cost, and must be scheduled carefully in respect to distance and time. Much careful thought and labor goes into the selection and preparation of these exhibits, and much experience is being gained in what is essentially a pioneering field of endeavor. The first circuit exhibition ever made up in the U. S. was organized over 50 years ago, by Ella Bond Johnson, Director of the Art Association of Richmond, Indiana, for the purpose of bringing the work of nationally recognized painters to Richmond.


